What is Financial Aid?

Money that helps you pay for undergraduate and graduate school expenses at a college or university. It can be in the form of free money or a loan.



Types of Financial Aid

GIFT AID:

GRANTS: free money that does not have to be repaid.

SCHOLARSHIPS: free money that does not have to be repaid.

GOAL:

SELF HELP AID:

LOANS: Money you borrow and must pay back with interest.

WORK STUDY: Provides part-time jobs for students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay for education related expenses.

Get Ready to complete FAFSA

Create FSA ID

For you AND your parent

FSA ID is a username and password used to access federal student aid sites and also serves as your electronic signature.

Gather Documents Needed to Apply

2022 tax forms (typically 1040 tax forms & W2)

Need to know:

- social security number
- if applicable: parents' SSN, email addresses, birthdays, date of marriage



FSA ID

The FSA ID is a digital signature used to:

- Sign the FAFSA, and Master Promissory Notes (Direct and Parent PLUS Loans)
- Access Federal Student Aid websites



Each person creates their own FSA ID with SSN and Date of Birth
(SSN no longer needed for parents who are not U.S. citizens)
